I never knew the name Randall even existed until the evening of his baptism.

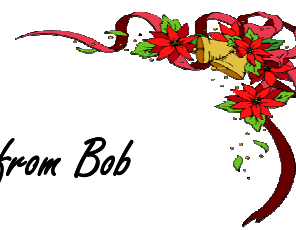
Randy said that he preferred the name Randall on his baptismal certificate to honor his parents who had prayed for him year after year to surrender his life to Jesus.
